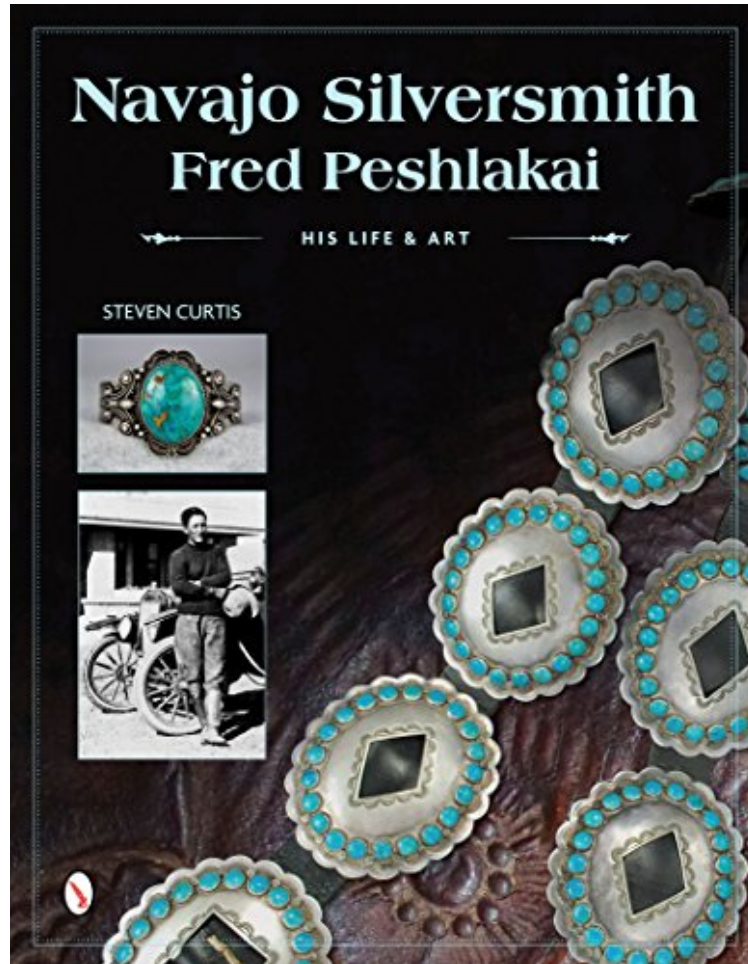

Author Steven Curtis takes the reader on a journey, setting the stage of the Dine people and culture. He uses a large number of historic photos to tell the story of the family of Fred Peshlakai, followed by marvelous examples of Peshlakai's work.The presentation of the breadth of Peshlakai's designs is excellent. The details of Peshlakai's signatures and his hallmark tools and stamping is especially important. I enjoyed the section on the striking individual stamps of Fred Peshlakai.An appendix highlights talented artist Art Tafoya who makes
