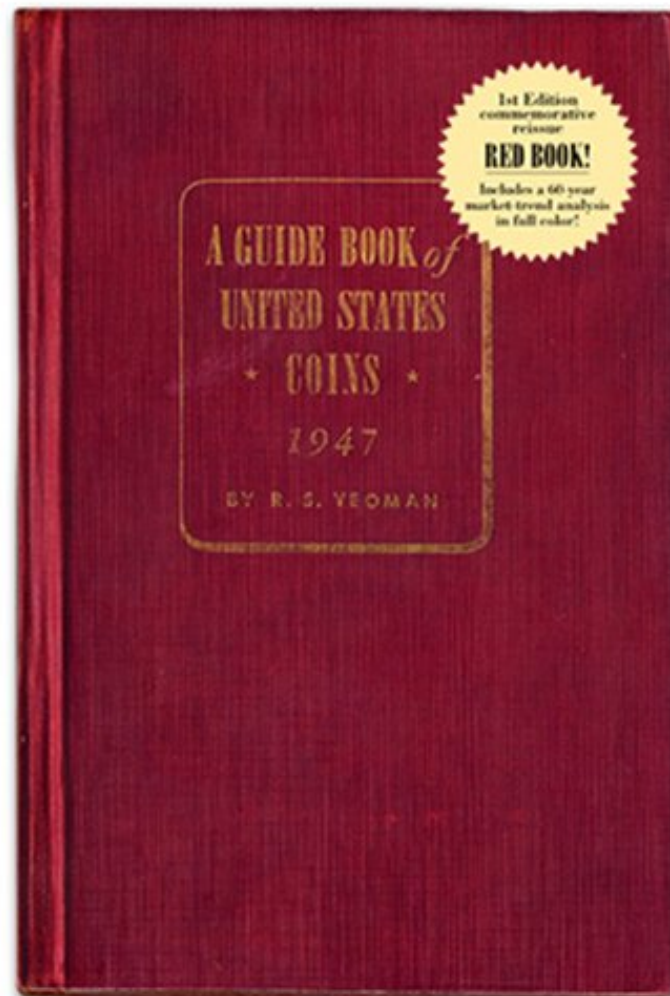

Specialist This book is - for current coin collecting - totally obsolete. But this ancient price guide is not intended to help one make buying decisions. It is simply a glimpse at history: The history of US coins and the history of collecting those coins. Both have changed quite a bit. Needless to say, one wishes they could have bought coins in the past armed with current price trend information. However, this is not "Back to the Future", but simply just back. Those old commemorative coins which cost so much today could be had for pocket change in 1947. Since this book in its original printing is almost impossible to find - and costs a fortune if you can find it, this is a really great deal. Unlike current Redbooks which will collect dust for decades after the next edition comes out, this book is a lot of fun to refer to again and again and can even be a conversation item for those who are not numismatists. One should consider that this book was printed in 2006 and once these are sold out, Whitman might never reprint it again. It is a fun reference and reasonably priced.
