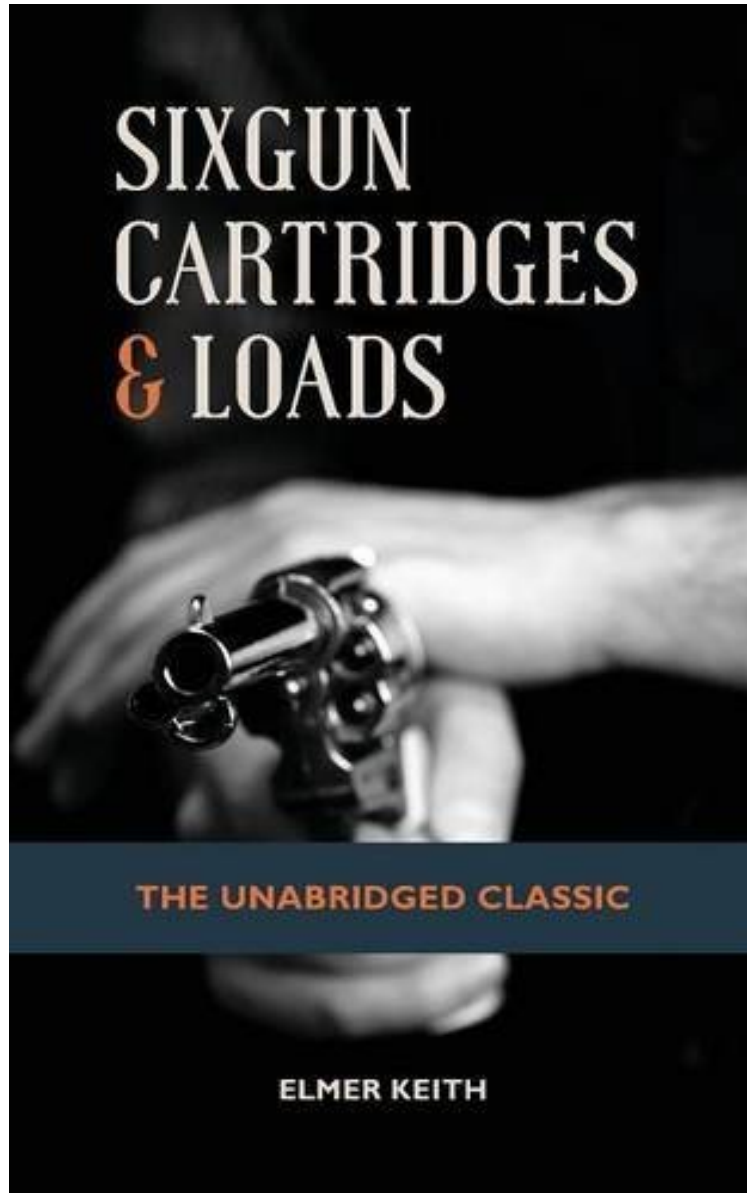

from his personal experimentation and experience to give sound advice for reloading sixgun cartridges. Technology and progress in sixgun and cartridge development since the book was published have added new gear and techniques but the basic principles discussed remain timeless, especially with regard to bore and groove size when casting bullets. Components have changed over the years and tools have evolved but Keith was an innovator and contributor to handgun loads and loading. His contributions to cast bullet development are alive and well today and reflect his rugged individualism garnered from growing up and living in the western states during the depression.
