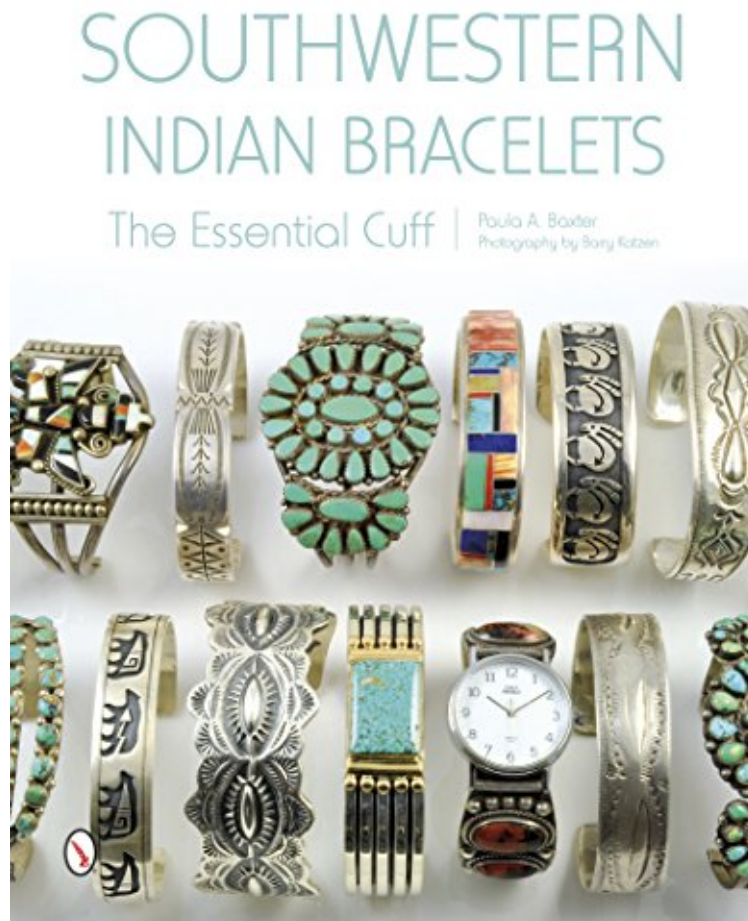


Southwestern Indian Bracelets: The Essential Cuff
